

Equity & Access Checklist

Questions to help identify gaps and opportunities in your community.

1. Access to Programs & Services

- Are early childhood, K-12, and postsecondary programs available in all areas of the community?
- Are there neighborhoods or regions with limited access to key services?
- Do families have access to transportation to reach programs?
- Are program hours flexible enough to meet family needs?

2. Availability of Seats & Capacity

- Are there enough seats or openings for all age groups?
- Are waitlists longer in certain neighborhoods or for certain programs?
- Are infant and toddler openings especially limited?
- Do capacity gaps align with population growth or demographic shifts?

3. Affordability & Financial Barriers

- Are program costs affordable for most families?
- Do families have access to subsidies, scholarships, or financial aid?
- Are there gaps between subsidy availability and actual program capacity?
- Are fees, supplies, or transportation costs creating barriers?

4. Quality & Program Experience

- Are high-quality programs available across all neighborhoods?
- Do quality ratings differ by region or provider type?
- Are families able to access programs that match their needs (language, special needs, cultural relevance)?
- Are staff qualifications and training consistent across regions?

5. Student Groups & Equity Gaps

- Are certain student groups underrepresented in advanced coursework or enrichment programs?
- Are there gaps in attendance, performance, or graduation rates across student groups?
- Do multilingual learners, students with disabilities, or economically disadvantaged students face additional barriers?
- Are supports equitably distributed across schools and regions?

6. Community Resources & Supports

- Are mental health, counseling, and family support services available in all areas?
- Do families know how to access available supports?
- Are community partnerships evenly distributed across neighborhoods?
- Are high-need areas receiving targeted support?

7. Communication & Engagement

- Are materials available in multiple languages?
- Are families included in decision-making processes?
- Are communication methods accessible to all families (digital, print, in-person)?
- Are families aware of available programs and opportunities?

8. Trends Over Time

- Are equity gaps widening, narrowing, or staying the same?
- Are improvements consistent across regions and student groups?
- Are new barriers emerging due to population changes or economic shifts?

9. Questions for Follow-Up

- What areas need deeper exploration?
- Which groups or neighborhoods need additional support?
- What next steps should be taken to improve equity and access?
